Professor Mailhiot taught four sections in both the Spring and Fall 2017. Her class averages were 2.48 and 3.06 The students had 96.7% and 93.9% completion rates and 72.14% and 87.3% success (C or better) rates.

Spring 2017 student evaluations (IOTA) were positive with factor scores ranging from 4.44 to 4.58.

Fall 2017 student evaluations (IOTA) were positive with factor scores ranging from 4.63 to 4.70. Student comments suggested that Professor Mailiot provides interactive, hand-on instructions that help student learn complex material.

Professor Mailiot revised ETV101 Syllabus to implement and collaborate with our new partnership with Virtua Sound Studios. She worked closely with TV Manager, Michael Henry and Asst. Manager, Michael Greene to create a new equipment rotation cycle, hands-on troubleshooting guides for

the new equipment at our off campus facility and developed new programs and projects for the students in our new space.

Growing our Community involvement, in Fall 2017 I partnered with Erica Frankin and the Tri-State K9 Response Team, and Spring 2018 with the Palmyra Cove Harbor Park to produce our ETV 102 field production documentaries. This partnership has provided students real-world experience with developing a repoire with clients, critique and field experience that they will be able to display on a industry "reel" or video resume in the video production job market.

During Fall 2017, the Communication Arts Program went through Middle States Program Review. Professor Mailiot organized documentation for Alaina Walton and the Compliance, Assessment and Research Department to include Syllabi, Adjunct CVs, Program Documents and completed detailed Review Paperwork for Communication Arts Consultant. She arranged for Communication Arts, ETV and ETS students to attend luncheon for Q & A with Middle States Consultant. These students discussed the program and had an open dialogue with the Consultant.

Amy Franzini Ph.D. the Communication Arts Program Consultant's Report, stated that the "biggest strength of the Communication Arts program is the dedication of the faculty who teach in it. Most specifically, the program coordinator, Brooke Mailhiot is a one-woman "machine" who is driving both this and the Entertainment Technologies programs ahead. Her enthusiasm transfers to her students and she continues to find ways to make the program successful, even in the face of shrinking space and resources."

For RCBC Open Houses, she created large format panel graphics, and rack cards for potential ETV/ETS students.
