Professor Mailhiot received positive IOTA scores and many positive comments from students. She also received positive score and remarks on her classroom observation.

Professor Mailhiot taught six sections in the Spring 2016 semester and five sections Fall 2016 semester. The average class GPA in those semesters was 3.07 and 3.17. The students had 90.7% and 95.7% completion rates and 74.1% and 84.8% success (C or better) rates.

She continued to improve her classes through implementing new technologies and instruction. She has been the recipient of Perkins Grant funding which has allowed her purchase equipment to enhance her programs and courses. She incorporated student projects in the first annual Arts Showcase. She collaborates within and outside of the college to provide students with learning opportunities and to give back to the community. She continually is looking for new opportunities to enhance the courses she teaches.

She has become completely paperless with implementing Bb for all of my courses. Utilizing Google Drive for video files and access has been great. She has incorporated online Discussion Boards in her classes to involve shy students into the conversation.

Professor Mailhiot re-evaluated the entire Entertainment Technologies Program and made various changes including: ETV & ETS IAC Program Course Changes, Credit Changes and Pre-Requisite changes. These changes were made to ensure more effective transfer with Rowan University to numerous other 4-year institutions. She worked directly with Rowan University Faculty and RCBC Faculty to finalize the Rowan University 2+2 partnership. She worked with Professor Russell Gartner and shifting a MUS course into the program will benefit the students greatly. Having a fundamentals music course will assist the students who are attending RCBC for a career driven degree or transferring.

She incorporated COM120 Radio production into the ETV coursework which will allow students to create a better understanding of writing, speaking, and technology. She hosted two Coffee Hours for ET Department to discuss future of program and IAC changes. She also met with Assessment Coordinator, Alana Walton, and updated all ETV/ETS CLOs and planned out new Assessments over the next 4 years.
